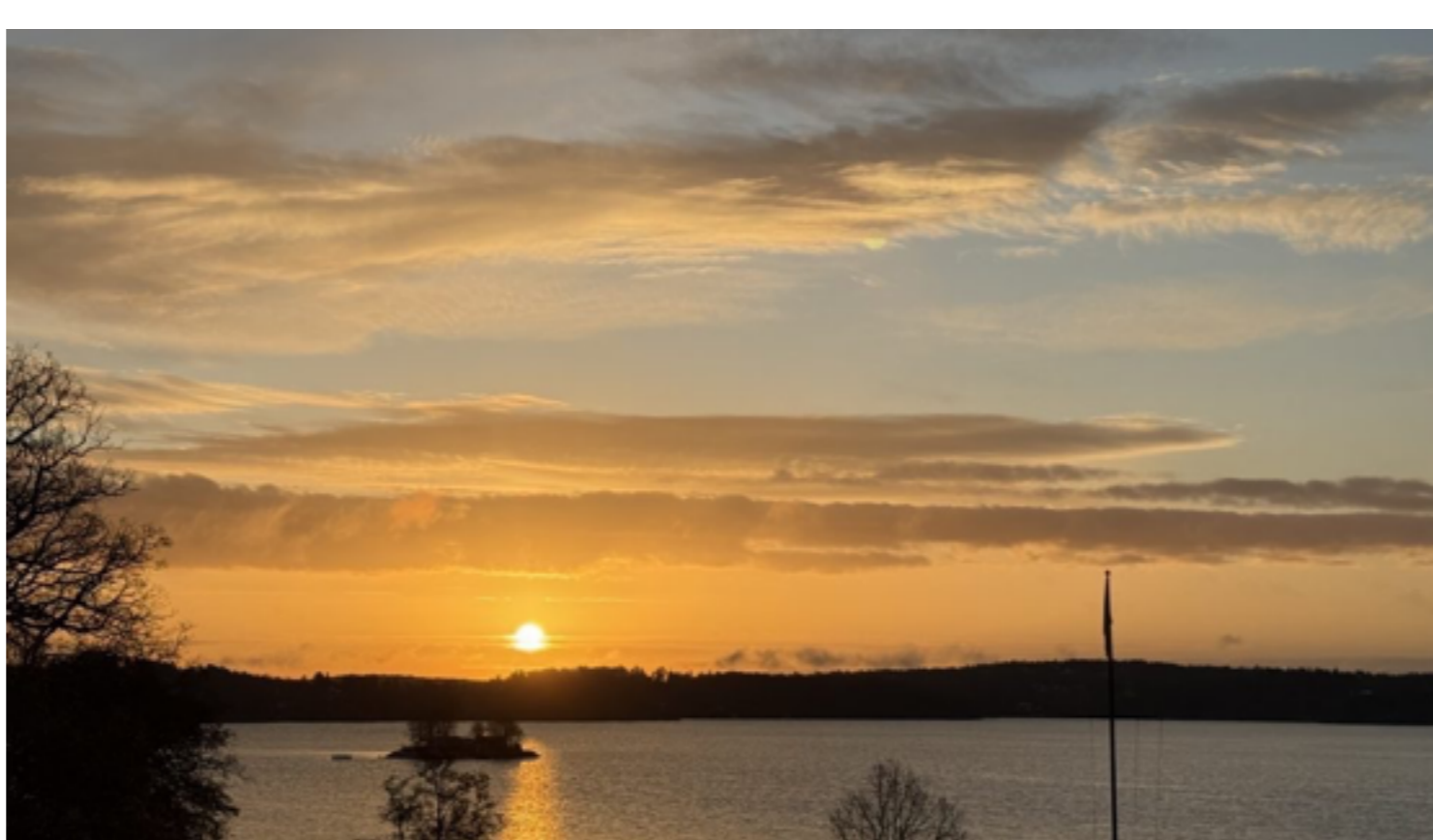

## New Guidelines Push for Ethical Reflection in Research Reporting

A recent study highlights the urgent need for ethical reflection in research reporting, especially in fields driven by emerging technologies such as Artificial Intelligence.

Published in PLOS ONE by an international team of researchers, including Associate Professor and former Digital Futures Scholar in Residence Simon Knight of the University of Technology Sydney, the study introduces new guidelines aimed at fostering deeper ethical considerations in research publications.

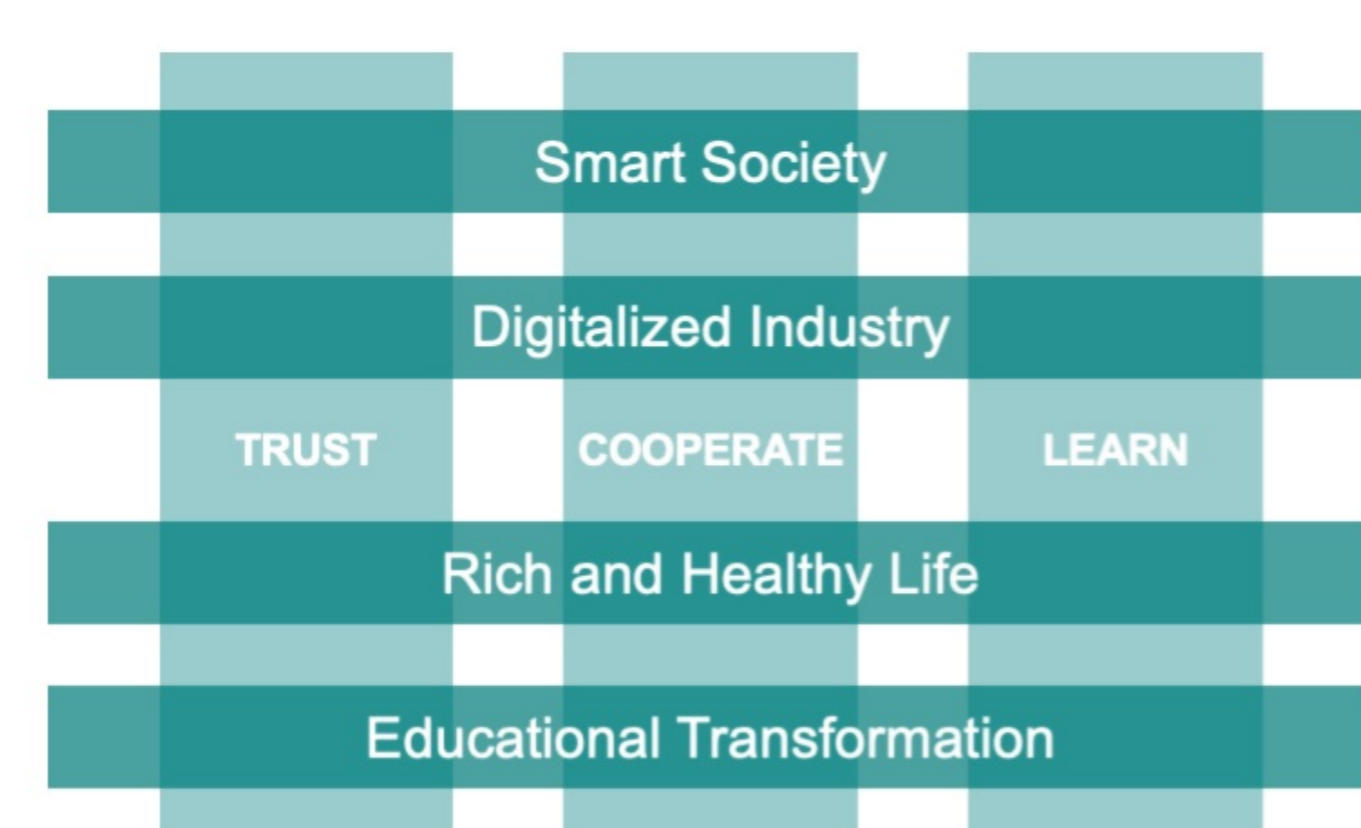
## Call for Abstract Deadline: 18 December 2024
